## Nancy Ypma's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

St. George's Music Director and Organist, Nancy S. Ypma, D.Mus., has been with us 25 years this month!

Nancy received her B.A. in Music, cum laude, from the University of California, and her Master of Music and Doctor of Music from Northwestern University, both in Organ Performance. She has also taken music and organ courses in Paris, France and Cambridge and Croydon in England.

Nancy has worked in churches all over California and Illinois, most of them Episcopal Churches. However, she has been at St. George's much longer than she has held any other job – except for the one she has held for 26 years at the same time as she has been part of our staff! Since 1988 Nancy has also been on staff at McKendree University. She has served as Chair of the Fine Arts Series, Director of Music, and Chair of Humanities. She is currently Professor of Music, University Organist, and Chair of the Division of Visual and Performing Arts.

At St. George's she serves as organist and pianist, and directs the Adult Choir and the Choristers, as well as being our resident expert when we added our wonderful pipe organ, and raising the money for the new piano in the church.

Nancy is faithful, dedicated, works wonderfully with our singers of all ages. Thank you for your many years at St. George's, and we're all praying for another 25!

#### **November Vestry Highlights**

Items discussed at the November 10, 2014, Vestry meeting included:

- Approved the disbursement of \$35,000 from the Toddhall Investments for repairs at Toddhall and began an update of the Toddhall Bylaws.
- Reaffirmed support of Terry Paeltz as a nominee for Holy Orders.
- Discussed the need to find persons to stand for Vestry to replace Chuck Evans, Brian Maves, and Michelle Ziegler, whose terms are expiring.
- Repairs to the Parish Hall heating system should be completed soon, and work on the elevator should begin shortly.
- Reviewed and accepted the Treasurer's Report for October.
- Discussed the viability of our Food Pantry and decided to have a meeting of volunteers and anyone interested to discuss the issues.
- Approved sending funds to Bethany Place, selling White Chili on Super Bowl Sunday with profits going to the Violence Prevention Center and Bethany Place, and heard that 100 children's names have been sent to us for the Angel Tree Christmas project.
- The Children's Christmas Pageant will take place at the 10:30 service on December 21, followed by a Cookie Reception, and we will also have a Blood Drive that day.
- St. George's will offer a Holy Eucharist in the Chapel on Thanksgiving Day at 9:00 am.
- Heard a report on the initial Stewardship Ingathering and discussed Scholarship and Investment funds for 2015.

# The Season of Advent: A Time of Preparation

The Church year begins with the season of Advent, four Sundays for us to prepare for the coming of Jesus – His Advent – His coming into the world. While everyone around us, and even sometimes we ourselves, are racing around making plans, shopping, cooking, wrapping, decorating, and worrying, Advent helps us to slow down, to recognize and respond to God's loving action of sending his Son to be born of a Virgin.

The central theme of Advent is waiting, symbolized by the pregnancy of Mary, a young Jewish woman whose people had waited long for the coming of the Messiah. Rushing into Christmas does harm to Advent's message of waiting and preparation.

St. George's uses the color blue during Advent. Blue is the color for Mary and for Heaven. It points away from making Advent a penitential season like Lent, which it is not. The theme of preparation

and expectation is shown in the gradual crescendo of light in the Advent wreath, representing the light of Christ dispelling the world's darkness.

Please join us as we gather with joy on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to announce the glorious news of "God with us" in His Son Jesus!

### **Community Service Commission Notes**

#### **Food Pantry**

The Food Pantry is at a crossroads. There were three obstacles to keeping the Pantry open, but one of them has solved itself. We were told in May that we must have someone trained as a certified Food Handler, and that person must then train all of our volunteers. But at our most recent inspection by the county (just last week), we learned that we are exempt from this requirement!

The second issue is, since we are purchasing most of the food, the current funds will be exhausted in about a year. We will need to figure out funding and encourage donations of both food and money to overcome this obstacle.

The last issue is that George Evans, after many years of serving as the Food Pantry Coordinator, is retiring at the end of the year. George puts in many hour per week checking supplies, buying food and stocking shelves. While it is unlikely only one person will step forward to take over George's job, if several people step forward we can divide the duties and overcome this obstacle.

Therefore a meeting was held on Tuesday, November 25, to discuss these problems. One alternative to keeping our Pantry open is to join the Interfaith Food Pantry, which is an association of 11 churches. The Vestry will discuss all these issues at their December meeting.

#### **Beacon**

Since the Vestry decided to join Beacon in lieu of continuing to run our own Crisis Fund, it was voted to split the balance remaining in the fund between St. Mark and St. George's. We will send our funds to Beacon, which is an association of about 45 church in the Belleville, Swansea, Fairview Heights, and Shiloh areas. They provide a wide variety of help to people in need.

One way is the financial help network. Calls are received and passed to a coordinator, who reviews them and directs the person to places where they can get help. This may include immediate financial help, directing them to another agency, or mediating a solution to their problem. Beacon has also started a counseling program, Breaking the Chains of Poverty, to help people overcome the long term cycle of crisis poverty. This may include training and/or assisting someone to find a job. Lindenwood is providing volunteer counselors for this program.

Beacon also serves meals and provides a program to homeless people twice a month at the Union United Methodist Church, and they run a program to distribute donated furniture to people in need.

Volunteers to man the telephones, serve meals or move furniture are always needed, as well as financial donations to assist with crisis situations.

#### **Blood Drive**

St. George's will host our Holiday Blood Drive in the Parish Hall on Sunday, December 21, from 9:00 am – 1:00 pm. As usual, blood supplies are expected to run especially low during the holidays, and this drive will help to provide blood for those dealing with cancer, burns, or accidents. Details on the drive will follow in the Sunday bulletins.

#### **Reusable Shopping Bags**

The Community Service Commission has purchased a number of reusable shopping bags. These can be used for your own shopping in place of using plastic or paper bags, or for bringing donations to the Food Pantry. The bags are for sale in the Canterbury Room.
